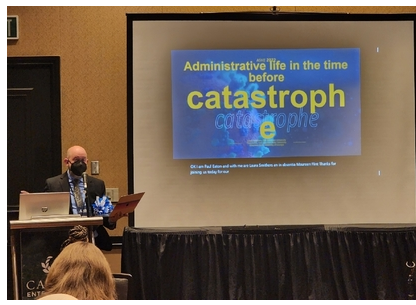

100 Black Men of Metropolitan Houston Conference

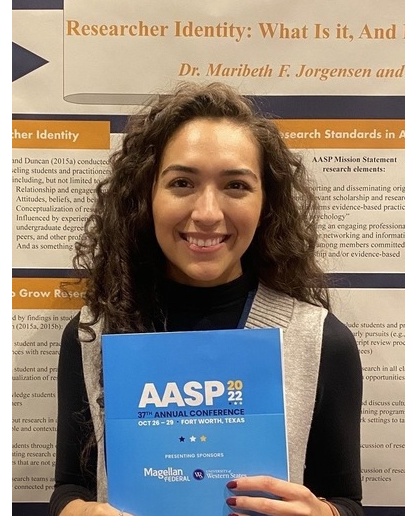

Thai Colleagues Visit SHSU

Last week, the College of Education and the Center for International Education held a set of workshops for four visiting professors from the Research Methodology Program at Ubun Ratchathani Rajabhat University (UBRU) located in northeastern Thailand. Their visit aimed to establish a relationship between the relevant departments and our universities. The workshops were aimed to exchange perspectives and experiences on educational research methodologies, strategies,

technology use, and data analyses. Trends and developments in teacher education in both countries were also discussed. Drs. Bill Edgington, Nara Martirosyan, Susan Skidmore, Andrey Koptelov, Salim Sehlaoui, Jim Hynes, Debbie Price, and Melanie Kinskey shared their expertise and presented their research during the meetings.
